



### Review verses 1 - 3 (Wuest)

Truth I [Paul] speak in Christ

I am not lying



that I have a consuming grief, a great one [*mega*] and intense anguish in my heart without a let-up.

For I could wish For I was continually praying in the past

Interlinear + Imperfect

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that I myself were accursed from Christ Not possible Rom 8:38-39

on behalf of my brethren, my kindred according to the flesh

# Review verses 4 - 5 (Wuest)

Privileges in Grace of the Old Testament Israelites

- Who in character are Israelites,
  - God's chosen people
- Who are possessors of the position of a son by having been placed as such,
  - Ex 4:22 "Then you shall say to Pharaoh," Thus says the LORD, "Israel is My son, My firstborn."
- And [possessors] of the glory,
  - Ex 40:34 Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.
- And [possessors] of the covenants,
  - God made covenants uniquely with Israel like no other nation.



Review verses 4 - 5 (Wuest)

Privileges in Grace of Old Testament Israelites (cont.)

- And to whom was given the law,
  - Deut 4:8 Or what great nation is there that has statutes and judgments as righteous as this whole law which I am setting before you today?
- And who are possessors of the sacred service
  - Ex 20:24 You shall make an altar of earth for Me, and you shall sacrifice on it your burnt offerings and your peace offerings, --- I will come to you and bless you.
- And [possessors of] the promises, of whom are the fathers
  - Paul call Israel "the children of the promise."
- And [Israel] out from whom is the Christ according to the flesh
   the One who is above all, God eulogized forever. Amen.



Introduction to Verses 6 - 9\*

 As we have seen from verses 4 and 5 God has uniquely blessed the nation Israel



- But because Israel has for the most part rejected God's righteousness and promises, several questions have arisen:
  - Are the promises of God of no effect?
  - Did God fail?
  - Did God lie?
- Paul begins to deal with these questions in verses 6 9 (today's lesson)
- And will continue in verses 10 13 (next week's lesson)

# Today's Verses



- <sup>6</sup> But *it is* not as though the word of God has failed. For they are not all Israel who are *descended* from Israel;
- <sup>7</sup> nor are they all children because they are Abraham's descendants, but: "Through Isaac your descendants will be named."
- <sup>8</sup> That is, it is not the children of the flesh who are children of God, but the children of the promise are regarded as descendants.
- <sup>9</sup> For this is the word of promise: "At this time I will come, and Sarah shall have a son."

- <sup>6</sup> But *it is* not as though the word of God has failed.
  For they are not all Israel who are *descended* from Israel
  But *it is* not as though lit: [*it is*] not however that
  the word of God [to Israel]
- has failed *ekpiptō* to fall down from, to fall powerless, to be without effect perfect tense
- The word [of God] with reference to Israel has <u>not</u> failed to work effectively in time past and at present is still potentially effective. Wuest
- Num 23:19 God is not a man, that He should lie, ---has He said, and <u>will He not do it</u>? or has He spoken, and <u>will He not make it good</u>?
- Now some statements about what is a "true" Israelite:

<sup>6</sup> But *it is* not as though the word of God has failed.

For not all the ones of Israel, are Israel Interlinear ones of [*ek*] Israel – lit: out of Israel as a source

 those who are out of Israel as a source are the physical nation

# are [true] Israel

- <u>Summarizing</u>: For not all they who are of Israel [born of the patriarch], are Israel [the people of God] Denny
- Physical birth did not determine if you were a true Israelite.

more on: for not all the ones of Israel, are Israel

#### parallel verse:

- Rom 2:28 For <u>he is not a Jew who is one outwardly</u>, nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh.
- <sup>29</sup> But he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that which is of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter.
  - Heart circumcision is a spiritual operation that the Holy Spirit performs, not a physical operation that conforms to the letter of the Mosaic Law. Constable

# Christ's testimony:

- John 3:3 Jesus answered and said to him [Nicodemus], "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."
- John 3:10b "Are you the teacher of Israel and do not understand these things?"

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<sup>7</sup> nor are they all children because they are Abraham's HER descendants, but: "Through Isaac your descendants will be named."

Paul will now give a further explanation of 6b

neither because they [Israel] are seed of Abraham, are they all children [of God] Interlinear

- So, Paul will now go a step further and say even if you are Abraham's seed, it does not make you a true Israelite
- children is *tekna* i.e., children in the sense which entitles them to the [spiritual] inheritance

- Now Paul will begin to show God's sovereign plan for the nation of Israel:

<sup>7</sup> nor are they all children because they are Abraham's descendants, <u>but: "Through Isaac your descendants will be named."</u>

#### but, in Issac your seed will be called

Interlinear

- Gen 21:12 But God said to Abraham, Do not be distressed because of the lad [Ishmael] and your maid;
   --- for through Isaac your descendants shall be named.
- A true Israelite must flow from the child of promise\*
- Ishmael was not the child of promise\*
- Born-again descendants of Abraham; these are the ones that received the promise\*
- Those who did not exercise faith did not receive the promise\*

<sup>7</sup> nor are they all children because they are Abraham's HHBC descendants, <u>but: "Through Isaac your descendants will be named."</u>

### more on God's promise:\*

- Even though God promised to bless Abraham's descendants
- It was only one branch of his family [Abraham] that He singled out for special blessing
- God's special elective purpose applied only to Isaac
   and his line of descendants
   \* Constable
- The next verse will explain how "your" [Abraham's] descendants will be called and counted through the line of Isaac

<sup>8</sup> <u>That is, it is not the children of the flesh who are children of God</u>, but the children of the promise are regarded as descendants.



- That is what follows tell us what "the promise" is like *it is* not the children of the flesh who are children of God Who are the children of the flesh?
- the natural children of Abraham [his blood line]
- So "children of God" in the Old Testament was more than just by physical birth
- Physical birth never made anyone a child of God\*
- The next part of the verse tells us who are the <u>true</u> <u>children of God</u>

<sup>8</sup> That is, it is not the children of the flesh who are children of God, <u>but the children of the promise are regarded as descendants</u>.

- He [Paul] spoke of blessing Abraham's seed uniquely
- It was only the children born supernaturally in fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham about seed - namely, Isaac's descendants

More on the children of promise:

- So, this promise results in true descendents of Abraham
- This is God's grace in action in Abraham's life
- God's sovereign choice relative to the seed and identity of God's people has always been on the basis of grace-promise-blessing

- What counts is grace, not race

- This promise is described in verse 9


<sup>9</sup> For this is the word of promise: "At this time I will come, and Sarah shall have a son."



For this is the word of promise


- By the context "this" is referring to last part of verse 9 which is a quote from Gen 18:10
- Gen 18:9-10: Then they [the Lord and two men] said to him, "Where is Sarah your wife?" And he said, "There, in the tent." <sup>10</sup> He said, "I will surely return to you at this time next year; and behold, Sarah your wife will have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent door, which was behind him.
