Philippians 3:12-16 The call of God in Christ Jesus #2

Let's read the text verses 1-16, beginning with first 7 verses

- *3:1 Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things *again* is no trouble to me, and it is a safeguard for you.
- ² Beware of the dogs, beware of the evil workers, beware of the false circumcision;
- ³ for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh,
- ⁴ although I myself might have confidence even in the flesh. If anyone else has a mind to put confidence in the flesh, I far more:
- ⁵ circumcised the eighth day, of the nation of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the Law, a Pharisee;
- 6 as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to the righteousness which is in the Law, found blameless.
- ⁷ But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ.



Now verses 8-11

- *3:8 More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ,
- ⁹ and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,
- that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death;
- 11 in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.



Some Observations as a review

1:1-2 Salutation v2:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ"

1:3-11 God's work in believers is perfect v6:

"He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus"

1:12-18 God spreads His gospel even in adversity v12:

"my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel"

1:19-30 Believers are united to Christ forever v21:

"to live is Christ and to die is gain"

2:1-4 Believers now should be united to each other v2: "... by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose"

2:5-18 Believers now should be revealing Christ v13:

"it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure"

2:19-24 Timothy revealed Christ's focus on others v20: "For I have no one else of kindred spirit who will genuinely be concerned for your welfare"

Some Observations on verse 10-12 from last week's lesson

*1:10 that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death;

11 in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.

What is he wanting to fully obtain?

Refers back to vs. 10, 11:

- TO KNOW HIM
- TO KNOW THE POWER OF HIS RESURRECTION
- TO HAVE THE FELLOWSHIP OF HIS SUFFERINGS (NOT ON THE CROSS; BUT IN THE HERE AND NOW)
- CONFORMITY WITH HIS DEATH

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How is this fully obtained?

- By pressing onward to take that for which I was taken by Christ Jesus
- We reach out to take what God in Christ purposed for us, His kind of life.
- We are clay vessels, designed by God, to have His life

Paul's use of the Running the Race metaphor involves:

- Don't look back; you keep your eyes forward; what lies behind is a distraction; even good things or accomplishments
- Don't carry excess baggage; or drop it ...
- Keep your eyes focused on the finish line; ... to keep your direction straight
- And stretch / reach for the finish line tape. ... the only use in the N.T.
- Merryman: v. 13 is a men de construction:
 'On the one hand, I forget what's behind,
 on the other hand, I reach forward to what's ahead'
- It is clear why Merryman calls this the mental dynamics of the Christian life....

The race is the life here on earth

- The goal is the finish line v. 11's the out-resurrection of the dead (or Rapture for those alive in Christ)
- The prize: the actual possession of Christ Jesus Himself in glory, enjoying His presence in our glorified bodies
- The prize is bound up with the calling; promised when the call is issued and given when the call is fulfilled (Vine)
- The upward call (high calling) is from heaven and to heaven (Vine)

The Summary to this central message in Philippians is:

- Our spiritual maturity is God's goal for us
- Our thinking can now be persuaded by God to be His thinking
- We can have different thoughts than God's
- Spiritual maturity is reached by God's pathway, a forward looking process
- God is the One who will reveal His pathway, methods & goal to everyone of us

The Conclusions to this central message are that:

- The call of God is to progressively mature us, that is His goal for us
- The call of God includes us learning to let God show & honor just Christ
- The call of God includes us living in harmony with God's goal
- The call of God includes us thinking His thoughts.

*1:13 so that my imprisonment in *the cause of* Christ has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else,

Observations on Chapter 1, verse 13

Does "well known" give us the focus of "has become"?

Yes, this tells us that God has revealed, phanaros, made visible, that this imprisonment is different from human normal imprisonment.

This is divine, & this is something even unbelievers could see was different.

This, "well known" is a key to understanding many passages about God's ways, because His goal is to consistently communicate with men about Himself.

He reveals Himself in His creation, and in the scriptures we see Him repeatedly showing man His presence. The Star at His birth, the shepherds were told of His birth, and where they could go to see Him.

And the above is repeated for us in Chapter 3:8-16,

Here is a progressive teaching of God, that His goal is to reveal Christ in us, His vessels of clay

*1:14 and that most of the brethren, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear.

Observations on Chapter 1, verse 14

What is the significance of the word "most" in this verse? It indicates that most but not all the brethren reacted correctly to Christ's imprisonment of Paul.

Is the word "trusting" translated consistently in Philippians?

No, there are 6 places that use this word in Philippians, & it means "persuaded". The references are; Phil 1:6, 14, 25, 2:24, 3:3, 4. There are 52 uses in NT total.

God persuades, He prods us to action. He arranges the circumstances to get us to think in harmony with His thoughts. So we like Paul, can rejoice is suffering.

Why does God persuade us instead of just making us do His will?

His ways are to have His thinking about revealing His glory and His plan for us is to learn that we share His suffering in preparation as His clay vessels, that He is making us into His instruments for helping others. We can think like Him now!

Eph 4:13 says God persuades us to have His thinking.

God says we now have His Spirit and nature and so we can grow and experience both His joy and His pain knowing that each thing He brings our way is; for our good and that His goal is to reveal and exalt Christ..



The emphasis today is the repeated lesson of God

1 To have His thinking, during all circumstances

2 To allow Him to reveal to us and show through us Christ's Glory

This is God's grace, that we may now live in harmony with God's supreme purpose:

THAT ALL MAY AKNOWLEDGE THE PERFECTION OF HIS SON the promised CHRIST, JESUS, OUR LORD

Coming up is the prize for us in the coming weeks both citizenship & a personal home in heaven.

The following is the preparation for this lesson of carefully reading and translating what God has given us in these verses.

Upon this foundation this lesson has been given.

Now from Wuest's expanded translation, 3:7-11:

*3:7 But whatever things were to me a gainful asset, these things I have considered a loss when it comes to my acquisition of Christ, and still so consider them. 8 Yes, indeed, therefore, at least, even I am still setting all things down to be a loss for the sake of that which excels all others, my knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord which I have gained through experience, for whose sake I have been caused to forfeit all things, and I am still counting them dung, in order that Christ I might gain, ⁹ yes, in order that I might in the observation of others be discovered by them to be in Him, not having as my righteousness that righteousness which is of the law, but that righteousness which is through faith in Christ, that righteousness which is from God on the basis of faith. Yes, for His sake I have been caused to forfeit all things, and I count them but dung, 10 in order that I might come to know Him in an experiential way, and to come to know experientially the power of His resurrection and a joint-participation in His sufferings, being brought to the place where my life will radiate a likeness to His death, 11 if by any means I might arrive at the goal, namely, the out-resurrection from among those who are dead.



Wuest's expanded translation continued, 3:12-16:

*3:12 Not that I already made acquisition or that I have now already been brought to that place of absolute spiritual maturity beyond which there is no progress, but I am pursuing onward if I may lay hold of that for which I have been laid hold of by Christ Jesus. 13 Brethren, as for myself, as I look back upon my life and calmly draw a conclusion, I am not counting myself yet as one who has in an absolute and complete way laid hold [of that for which I have been laid hold of by Christ Jesus]; but one thing: I, in fact, am forgetting completely the things that are behind, and am stretching forward to the things that are in front; 14 bearing down upon the goal, I am pursuing on for the prize of the call from above of God which is in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵ As many therefore as are spiritually mature [in a relative sense], let us be constantly of this mind. And if, as is the case, in anything you are differently minded, and that, in an evil sense, this also will God reveal to you. ¹⁶ Only one thing, so far as we have come, let us keep our lives in the same path.



Vern Peterman's expanded translation, 3:7-11:

*3:7 But whatever things were in the past entered in my personal ledger being valued as gain from my perspective [being my Jewish lineage, heritage and accomplishments as measured by Mosaic Law and the tradition of the Pharisees], those things I have now after careful consideration completely valued as and entered in my personal ledger as a total loss for the sake of Christ. 8 Beyond that, I have a perspective such that I now continually count all things to be entered in my personal ledger as a loss in view of realizing the surpassing value, above all present and former things, of the personal knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all the things I once valued as a gain in my personal ledger, and now continue to count them in value only a totally worthless waste on the basis that I have in the past gained Christ, 9 and in order that I will be found by Him in Him, not then or now having a righteousness from my own self-efforts which has been achieved by keeping the Mosaic Law and the human traditions added to it by the Pharisees, but in sharp contrast, that righteousness which is completely through faith, trust and confidence in the person and work of Christ, that is, the very eternally established measure of absolute righteousness which is Christ Himself, which comes from God only on the basis of faith in Christ,

10 My aim and constant aspiration is that I would continually know Jesus Christ personally and also know the unique and extraordinary power of His specific resurrection in my present life and that I would know the common participation in His sufferings, by God's doing outwardly expressing the inner nature of Jesus Christ in my life by reason of my being identified with Him in His death; 11 so then – in God-given fulfillment of my confident expectation - I will arrive at the intended destination which is the outresurrection out from the dead ones, having then, a resurrection body as does Jesus Christ, with whom I have been identified.



Vern Peterman's expanded translation continued, v12-16:

*3:12 Just so you don't misunderstand me, I want you to know that I have not even at this point already taken possession by my own actions of total knowledge of Christ or of conformity with Him, nor have I already been made completely spiritually mature by being conformed to His image by God's own doing, but, I am right now continuing to press on without hesitation or letup in order that I will take down as a prize that for which I also was taken down as a prize by Christ Jesus at the time when He pursued me as a prize. 13 Brethren in Christ – having spiritual relationship with one another because of relationship with Him, I do not make a judgment regarding myself, based on careful consideration, as having already taken down the prize; but I have one thing in my focus: I am constantly in the process of forgetting what lies in the past and I am continually reaching forward to what lies ahead in the future, 14 I am right now continuing to press on without hesitation or letup, looking with constant attention toward the person of Christ for the prize of the upward call of God in the heavenlies, when this life is completed at His declaration, which upward call to me as the victor I have by reason of my being in Christ Jesus, which will bring me to a place of being rewarded by Christ and being fully conformed to Him – only at that victorious moment will my condition be permanently conformed to the position I already have in Christ.

15 Let us therefore, as the character of those who are approaching spiritual maturity, have this mindset, involving all of the mind, and settled perspectives and values; and if in any regarding any one of you has a mindset that is not in line with what I have written above, He will bring you to a place of personally understanding these essential truths that I have just now written down. 16 however, let us as believers in Christ continue along together in an orderly and consistent manner in our condition, as is fitting to the eternal position that we already have now in Christ.

Keep a watchful eye ever upon those who are mutilated, doing this for the purpose of bewaring of and avoiding the same. ³ For, as for us, we are the circumcision, those who by the Spirit of God are rendering sacred service and obedience, and who are exulting in Christ Jesus, and who have not come to a settled persuasion, trusting in the flesh [human worthiness and attainment].

⁴ Although as for myself, I [as a Jew] could be having confidence also in the flesh. If, as is the case, anyone else presumes to have come to a settled persuasion, trusting in the flesh, I could occupy that place, and with more reason; ⁵ eight days old in circumcision, my origin from Israelitish stock, belonging to the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew from true Hebrew parents [i.e., not a Hellenist], with reference to the law, a Pharisee, ⁶ with regard to zeal, persecuting the Church, with reference to that kind of righteousness which is in the law, become blameless.



Now from Wuest's expanded translation, 3:7-11:

*3:7 But whatever things were to me a gainful asset, these things I have considered a loss when it comes to my acquisition of Christ, and still so consider them. 8 Yes, indeed, therefore, at least, even I am still setting all things down to be a loss for the sake of that which excels all others, my knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord which I have gained through experience, for whose sake I have been caused to forfeit all things, and I am still counting them dung, in order that Christ I might gain, ⁹ yes, in order that I might in the observation of others be discovered by them to be in Him, not having as my righteousness that righteousness which is of the law, but that righteousness which is through faith in Christ, that righteousness which is from God on the basis of faith. Yes, for His sake I have been caused to forfeit all things, and I count them but dung, 10 in order that I might come to know Him in an experiential way, and to come to know experientially the power of His resurrection and a joint-participation in His sufferings, being brought to the place where my life will radiate a likeness to His death, 11 if by any means I might arrive at the goal, namely, the out-resurrection from among those who are dead.



Wuest's expanded translation continued, v12-16:

*3:12 Not that I already made acquisition or that I have now already been brought to that place of absolute spiritual maturity beyond which there is no progress, but I am pursuing onward if I may lay hold of that for which I have been laid hold of by Christ Jesus. 13 Brethren, as for myself, as I look back upon my life and calmly draw a conclusion, I am not counting myself yet as one who has in an absolute and complete way laid hold [of that for which I have been laid hold of by Christ Jesus]; but one thing: I, in fact, am forgetting completely the things that are behind, and am stretching forward to the things that are in front; 14 bearing down upon the goal, I am pursuing on for the prize of the call from above of God which is in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵ As many therefore as are spiritually mature [in a relative sense], let us be constantly of this mind. And if, as is the case, in anything you are differently minded, and that, in an evil sense, this also will God reveal to you. ¹⁶ Only one thing, so far as we have come, let us keep our lives in the same path.



Observations on Philippians 3:11 Translation & interpretation

*3:11 in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.

**3:11[I am] assuming that I may abide [factually abide] unto the (ek = out from, preposition prefix) out-resurrection [fully alive] of (obj gen) the deaths.

Assuming = adverb form of ϵ i $\pi\omega\zeta$ ei + pws, an assumtion that is possible Danker, $\pi\dot{\omega}\zeta$ [cp. prec.] enclitic adverb particle expressing an undetermined aspect somehow, perhaps, used in combination w. ϵ i Ac 27:12; Ro 1:10; 11:14; Phil 3:11. Out-resurrection is ἐξἀνάστασις ek+anastasis and Bauer-Danker, say it connotes a coming to fullness of life (this is only place used in NT)

The deaths = νεκρῶν adjective genitive masc pl from νεκρός, the deaths literally

There are two major views as to the meaning here of:
"the out from resurrection" of the deaths

- 1 This refers to us sharing His living nature, we are now new in kind, His kind. ie, he died for us, separating the death penalty from us, putting it on Him and we were crucified with Him, so that our Adamic old man with its fallen nature is now rendered no longer our slave master, present but off-line
- 2 This refers to assuming to be Raptured while being possibly dead or alive ie, Paul was in prison, so assumes he may be raptured out of death or life.



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1 This can not refer to our Rapture

Because

a If it is the Rapture, then we may have a partial Rapture in view here, ie we are Raptured only if we allow God to use us to show Christ.

b Grammatically, this is a likely true assumption, but the Rapture is promised by God to His called out (Church) ones, who believe Christ & His work saves them

c This assumption is prefixed by some humanly experienced conditions that have to be true to get to this conclusion

d The far context, chapter 1 verse 6 refers to our Rapture as, "the day of Christ", but the close context is about the spiritual maturity of showing Christ now.

e The next context is an explantion of this view, that God's purpose is to reveal Christ now and forever.



Observations on Philippians 3:11 Translation & interpretation

With view # 1, it is concluded then that:

a This refers to the same resurrection in view in v10, the resurrection life of Christ we now may progressively experience in power

b This is the goal of phase 2 of our salvation, experientially knowing Christ living now in and through us

c Paul knows and teaches emphatically that we are the clay objects of God's love He uses to reveal Christ

d We can not experience Christ showing Himself to and thru us, if we are not:

- 1) Experientially counting all things of human status valueless when compared to the absolutely supreme merit value of Christ's things.
- 2) Scripturally & experientially learning that we are God's clay fashioned instruments that are actually revealing Christ's essence
- 3) Joyfully experientially sharing Christ's suffering of dislike, rejection, and condemnation by this fallen world's systems, by our fallen natures, and by Satanic authorities.
- e Sharing now His resurrection life actually began when we began to believe in Him and His full work for us.
- f God will reward us for His works being allowed to flow to and through us until the Rapture.

Per 3:8-11, we can't fully experience this resurrection kind of life unless:

1 we count the human status for value, things of human merit, as rubbish

2 we have become acquainted with the abounding life of Christ by a knowledge of Him in the Scriptures. Not intellectually knowing Him alone, but we are now tasting of His eternal life, and He is sharing His life now, with us & through us

3 we become sharers with Christ in sufferings, which God has appointed us to share with Him per 1:29

The # 1 view points to our identified position in Christ, now true because we as an old man of Adam by nature died and now we as new men of His nature are raised with Him to be sharing His resurrection life. This is all now true, He is now our life.

Some passages related to the # 1 view

See 2 Cor 2:14-16 we are now an aroma of Christ

See 2 Cor 3:28 we are being conformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit.. Who is doing here? God

See Eph 2:4-6 God has raised us up alive to God, seated with Christ now, this is the place we have right now

We conditionally are growing into full maturity under the teaching ministry of our Heavenly God, it is an effective ministry, it is in His power!

See 1 John 3:19 it says the new us, His seed inside us, does not sin!

Our source of death is sin out of our deposed Sinful nature,

Our source of life is Christ's righteous, life His out of death-resurrected life

So do we believe Him that it is His works, that He prepared for us to walk in, and that we are united with Him now in His new in kind nature.

If not, He will persuade us to be thinking that this is His goal for us...



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View # 2 that this does refer to our Rapture

Because

a Paul is in prison and not positive he will be freed, ie may be put to death b Paul knows he will be raptured, he does not know if he will be alive or dead c ie., Paul says here that he may be raptured while alive or he may die and be raptured out from death, he is just not sure when he wrote this

It is concluded then that:

a This is simply a small parenthesis revealing Paul's uncertainty about being alive or dead at the Rapture.

b Though a few hold that there will be a partial Rapture of only those who have been faithful to allow God to show Christ thru them, there are many wise stewards of God's written Word who see this to be God's message to us about Paul's perspective that he may be alive or dead at the Rapture.

c This is the most logical meaning here, a simple expression of uncertainty based on uncertain circumstances



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View # 2 that this does refer to our Rapture

Some examples found of those holding view #2:

One positive example of this is, and there are many others...

Dr. Robert Lightner, quoted by Bob Dean in 2022-Philippians-074b.mp3 on line: "'Resurrection' (Php. 3:11) is the translation of ekanastasin, a Greek word used nowhere else in the New Testament. It means a partial resurrection out from among other corpses, literally an 'out-resurrection.' But why did Paul say he wanted somehow, to attain to the (out-) resurrection from the dead? Did he doubt he would be raised from the dead? Hardly... he was using this word to refer to the Rapture, thus expressing the hope that the Lord would return during his lifetime."

One potentially positive example of this is:

Pastor Chester McCalley in his Philippians commentary on verse 3:11: ... "What is the out resurrection? It may be that Paul is referring to the event of 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, which is sometimes called the rapture."
